The Leadership Seminar is the culminating experience of the EdS degree in educational leadership. This course is an individualized learning experience that supports the prospective school administrator in: integrating learning from coursework, internships and other professional experiences; completing a professional portfolio that documents knowledge, skills and dispositions required for administrator certification; and preparing for the state assessment required for administrator certification. This cousre begins with an informal presentation and review of the student's portfolio related to School of Education goals and state certification standards. Based on this evaluation, the student and instructor will develop and individual will develop an individual course of study addressing competencies that have not yet been documented. The formal presentation of the professional portfolio that documents all required competencies is the culminating experience of both the course and the program. : 27 credit hours in the EdS program.
