This guide outlines a path for degree completion at Webster University- San Antonio for the Bachelor of Arts in Management for students entering with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Applied Science degree from the Alamo Colleges. The Alamo Colleges include Northeast Lakeview College, Northwest Vista College, Palo Alto College, St. Philip's College, and San Antonio College.

This guide is not intended to replace individual academic advising. Students are strongly encouraged to meet with a Webster University Admissions representative early on to help ensure a smooth transfer experience.

## WEBSTER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Applicants to Webster University should have successfully completed an associate degree or at least two years of college-level work (64 semester hours) with a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Transfer coursework should include at least one college-level writing/composition class and one college-level mathematics course. While the above profile is recommended, each applicant will be given a thorough individual review.
